A Note from Dean

LISTENING TO THAT WOMAN'S VOICE...

Greetings to all this deep summer day,

They say that men won't ask directions. Some say it's the reason the Israelites wandered in the wilderness for forty years when forty days would have sufficed for the journey.

I rather doubt that, but... by the time you read this, there's a good chance this man will be asking for direction, *and accepting it from the voice of a woman.*

Not necessarily a real woman, mind you (computers can do such amazing things), nonetheless, an unmistakable woman's voice. She will say, "Prepare to turn right..." "Turn right now onto Interstate 90, and continue in the left lane." "Now follow the road..." "Stay in the left hand lane and prepare to take exit 911 in two miles. ... Now exit left..." And so on, and on, and on, all the way to Montana and back.

How often I forget that I have a *soul navigation system* within me. It comes compliments of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit, John says, guides us into all truth. The Spirit, John says in his Gospel, reveals and reminds us of the things of Christ. The Spirit, Scripture teaches, is our Counselor, Guide and Interpreter.

So why, on so many days, do I wake up to share in God's work and find myself doing all the heavy lifting? Why do I agonize over what must be done, over how to manage that intractable situation, over how to best lead or encourage or train or motivate? Oh, the strain of that. Oh, the stress and worry and burden of trying to discern God's will.

All the while, the inner voice of God's Holy Spirit is ready to give me authoritative guidance and direction, to keep me on a true course, to remind me of the things of Christ, to interpret all the confusing and conflicting signposts along the way. But I have to turn up the volume of the inner Voice - through prayer and stillness and listening - in order to receive the guidance.

Be still... and know that God is God. Be still and remember that God will direct your paths!

Pastors and lay friends, pray for me to listen to the inner Counsel of God's Spirit. And I will pray for you!

Hey Church! Get moving!

The following commentary from US Surgeon General Regina Benjamin, MD, MBA, is a collaboration between the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the American College of Sports Medicine (ACSM), and Medscape. (I have shortened the article for use in the district newsletter. This is certainly a piece of information that is useful for our selves, our families, and as we lead and interact with the people of the church. George)

As Surgeon General, my priorities focus on wellness and prevention. Earlier this year, I released my paper, *The Surgeon General's Vision for a Healthy and Fit Nation [2010]*.

There is, perhaps, no more serious challenges to the nation's health and well-being than those posed by obesity and overweight. Since 1980, obesity rates have doubled in adults and more than tripled in children. We see the sobering impact of these numbers in the high rates of chronic diseases, such as diabetes, heart disease, and other chronic illnesses, that are starting to affect our *children* more and more.

A few months ago, a study from The University of North Carolina [at Chapel Hill] School of Medicine reported that obese children as young as age 3 show signs of an inflammatory response that has been linked to heart disease later in life. I was pleased to join the First Lady for the launch of her *Let's Move!* campaign to solve the problem of childhood obesity within 1 generation.

Both my *Vision for a Healthy and Fit Nation* and the First Lady's *Let's Move!* campaign take a comprehensive approach that engages families and communities, as well as the public and private sectors. My *Vision for a Healthy and Fit Nation* is an attempt to change the national conversation from a negative one about obesity and illness to a positive conversation about being healthy and being fit. I want to encourage Americans to eat more nutritiously, exercise regularly, and maintain healthier lifestyles.

That is why I am asking healthcare organizations across this country to join the *Exercise is Medicine* initiative. *Exercise is Medicine* is a multinational, multiorganizational initiative. It brings physical activity to the forefront of disease prevention and treatment. (We are) asked to continue to build, support, and advocate for physical activity as an essential element of global health and well-being by committing to action:

- Communities, workplaces, and schools are asked to promote physical activity as an essential part of health and well-being.
- Members of the public are asked to educate and empower themselves to seek appropriate counseling on physical activity.

As professionals, we should remember that (people) are more likely to change their behavior if they have a meaningful reward -- something more than reaching a certain weight or dress size. The reward has to be something that each person can feel, enjoy, and celebrate. The reward *is* optimal health that allows people to embrace each day and live their lives to the fullest -- without disease, disability, or lost productivity. I hope you will join the *Exercise is Medicine* initiative. Together, America can become a Healthy and Fit Nation.

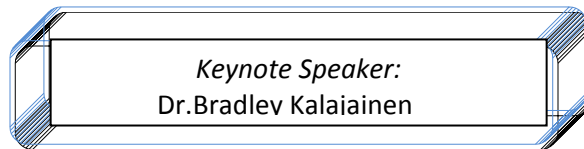

Imagine NO Malaria

Someone from the Mobilization Team will be contacting each church during the first week of August.

Remember – you were asked to show the Overview video to your congregation/leaders and put up the INM poster in the narthex where people can see it. Form a leadership team for your church to help get the work out.

A member of the Mobilization Team is willing to come and help you get started!!!!

The DS and some Mission Team members recently met with Laura Meengs, the field coordinator for 'Imagine NO Malaria' (the second stage of Nothing But Nets), to discuss how our District can be part of a concerted effort to combat malaria worldwide. Laura presented a plan which is working successfully in two other United Methodist conferences and is now being launched in our own Western Penna. Conference. Several persons have been asked to attend a training session, conducted by Laura, and will be sharing the campaign with every church in the District.

Where Nothing But Nets provided treated mosquito nets to persons in Africa, this next stage will provide prevention (nets plus medication), education (how to: recognize symptoms, what causes malaria, where and what treatment is available), communication (a radio station/towers broadcasting health information AND the Gospel of Jesus Christ), and treatment (more: medications, nets clinics and hospitals).

Malaria is more than a treatable disease, it is a "beatable" disease!! When you are contacted by one of the District presenters, please provide a setting/s for them to share the campaign with your congregants.

Two information gatherings have been held with four more regional times planed in June.

From that growing group – a Mobilization Team will be created. Members of the team will be available to speak with your church leaders, to help your church get on board.....together we can meet the goal to eliminate malaria by 2015

The Imagine No Malaria ministry is in full swing in the Western Pennsylvania Conference! We are blessed to have the support of many congregations and are thankful for the many more just starting to get involved in this life-saving ministry to work as the body of Christ in the fight against malaria.
