ENCOUNTER WITH CHRIST IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN

The first and most important event for this missional emphasis of our Conference is that we have achieved and surpassed the \$100,000 support goal adopted by the Western Pennsylvania Conference in its 2000 session. Encounter is a mission initiative of the entire denomination, established to promote initiatives in the autonomous Methodist Conferences of Latin America and the Caribbean. The General Board of Global Ministries holds all donations in a permanent fund, and distributes the interest earnings annually to be given in grants to projects in the member conferences. Encounter grants are issued to foster ministries in (1) health promotion (2) leadership training and pastoral education (3) ministries to women, children, and youth. The greater the permanent fund, the more ministries can be supported.

When the Western PA Conference adopted the support goal in 2000, it was hoped that the goal would quickly be realized. Challenges in the churches and the economy extended the time and effort needed to reach the goal. When we had reached the level of \$88,000 in 2012, however, the Conference Encounter Committee hoped that “one big push” would bring us through, so we proposed a special offering to be lifted on a Conference-wide basis on May 5, 2013. The Conference adopted the proposal, and the Bishop and Cabinet promoted the offering as the date approached. However, the offering brought in only \$6,000 of the \$12,000 needed. In Plenary Session at the 2013 Conference, a moment that was intended to be a celebration of achieving the goal turned, of necessity, into another plea. For several months, nothing more came in.

By the grace of God, two events changed everything. On the one hand, the Conference Global Ministries Committee voted to grant sufficient funds to complete the goal. On the other hand, the General Board of Global Ministries sponsored a special “Offering Day”, dollar matching incentive on December 3. This program would match dollars up to \$10,000, and would take place just as we were preparing to send in our Encounter funds. Thus, we exceeded our goal substantially, after struggling so hard just to achieve it! Praise be to God! This would not have happened without the vision and administrative talents of Stephanie Gottschalk, Mark Hecht, and especially Larry Bridge. We are blessed to have such servants of Christ working for us!

We should be aware of what we have achieved in meeting our goal. The permanent fund for Encounter currently holds about \$2,000,000 to generate mission projects, as stated above. Our contributions, being over 5% of the total holdings, essentially mean that, whenever Encounter fosters a mission, 5% of every project has been supported by our efforts. We are well represented in all of these missions. For that reason, the Encounter Newsletter, printed internationally, gave a note of special recognition to the Western PA Conference, as we fulfilled our promises.

Because Encounter exists as a permanent initiative of United Methodism, our Conference Encounter Committee still has a mandate to make interested donors and congregations aware of Encounter as a worthy channel of Christian mission support. We will also serve to foster contacts and UMVIM missions with the Methodist conferences of Latin America and the Caribbean.

An example of just such a mission emphasis was undertaken again this year, as the Encounter Committee sponsored a mission to Sincelejo, Colombia, in April 2013. We organized a UMVIM team to continue the construction project undertaken as a project of the NE Jurisdiction. The congregation is Sincelejo is badly in need of a building for

children's ministry. Many children are orphaned or fatherless, due to the ravages of the drug traffic. The church provides a trusted "safe haven" for the children and their leaders in Christian nurture. The team divided its efforts between construction and VBS style programs for the children. When the time in Sincelejo was done, the team had opportunity to visit the Methodist mission center at Brisas del Mar. This rural community was decimated a few years ago by the drug cartels, with a decade of teens "disappeared" in the conflict. The Colombian Bishop Cardona and UM mission professional Clinton Rabb made a heroic stand for human life, that changed the course of life in that community. Today, the Clinton Rabb Clinic fosters health in all the surrounding area, and the Methodist school (the only school) has had its first high school graduation in a decade, now that kids are surviving long enough to graduate. Mission experiences like this teach us all how vital it is that there be a witness for Christ for the essentials of humanity in this world. Lives, and souls, are being saved. This is our Encounter with Christ in Latin America.

WESLEY WOODS

God is good and faithful to those who love and serve the Lord. Wesley Woods has had a wonderful year living into that promise. The Ministry of the Gospel of Jesus Christ at Wesley Woods has continued to change lives and impact the world for the Kingdom.

2013 saw the beginning stages of change in our facility. Out a Ga-Ga Ball pit was completed close to the dining hall and is creating a new outdoor activity for our campers. With the help of Matt Jud, our Finance Chair, we have been able to balance the budget and dramatically reduce our debt. Wesley Woods is on track to be debt free by the end of 2014. We also received a significant gift toward our debt reduction from the Giles Family. Matt Kennedy is continuing to manage our website and increase our digital foot print; we also use our Facebook page to get the word out about events at Wesley Woods.

Wesley Woods is currently re-evaluating our ministry model and looking for ways to tweak, or completely rearrange (if necessary) our programming to match the changing needs and desires of our culture. We have a large campus and need to prayerfully consider how we manage our land for God's Glory. We are developing a vision for the future with the Board. We are also developing a strategic plan for the future and core tactics for execution to achieve our goals.

One of our goals is to increase the usage of the summer camping program; which has stayed flat from 2012 to 2013, exactly 763 registered campers. Another goal is to increase off season use, which has dwindled in part because we have officially been closed December through February. It is our plan to slowly rebuild our winter retreat ministry through targeted marketing in the local church and establishing collaborative efforts with local school and government institution where possible.

Wesley Woods is currently working on cleaning up our donor database. There are several reasons for this but primarily we need to know who is actively giving and where they designate their giving. Knowing this information will allow us to target a person based on their funding preference and enhance our efficiency for mailings. Further, cleaning this Database will make the year-end contribution receipts easier to process.

The Wesley Woods Board of Directors has voted to pursue a recreation facility to replace Harbin Hall. Harbin Hall is currently unusable due to ground shifting from the frigid winter. We are in the early stages of developing a capital campaign and will be rolling out information in the following months as we clearly define the parameters and goal of

the building. It is worth noting that there will be no programming offered in Harbin this year. At this moment we are currently building an outdoor replacement for our bouldering wall and have made the appropriate changes to our emergency action plans.

We at Wesley Woods are in the process of developing surveys to gain measured results of our staff experience as well as our camper experience. It is our belief that this data will allow Wesley Woods to improve our program offering and staff training to increase our effectiveness as Ministers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Doug Woodcock, Director of Maintenance, has done an incredible job of managing our facilities. The number of “fire drills” has reduced dramatically and we are convinced that is because of his care, attention to detail and his methodical approach to maintenance. We recently purchased a used Kubota 490 to replace our damaged 490. We are still seeking a maintenance truck. We have also utilized the resources our Creator gave us for our financial benefit. We have implemented a selective cutting program to manage our forests, funneling those funds into debt reduction and capital improvements. Recently we upgraded our Missionary 2 Cabin bathrooms so they are ADA compliant. Finally in maintenance, we have ensured that we have enough pasture to be compliant with the EPA regulations regarding amount of 1.66 acres per horse stall in the barn. This spring we have expanded our acreage from just over 10 acres to nearly 45 acres of horse pasture. The bouldering wall and the new horse pastures will be completed in time for our first full week of camp starting June 8, 2014.

The Wesley Woods Community is warm welcoming and wonderful. As I enter into this new phase of my life and ministry within this Faith community, I anticipate eagerly what the Holy Spirit will do through our shared ministry at Wesley Woods. Thank you for your continued prayers and support of our ministry. Without your assistance and coverage we would not be able to stand for the Gospel of Christ as a summer camp or retreat center.

As the conversation continues, a meaningful relationship is established. The relationship deepens to the point that she says that she longs for the water that will remove her thirst forever. We know the importance of relationships.

We, as a Cabinet, have spent the past months solidifying our relationship. This has been important as there have been many transitions. Colleagues have rotated off or will be. Seven members of the Extended Cabinet will have less than two years of service. We have celebrated the life and witness of our friend and historian, Bob Higginbotham. He taught us how to fight one of many of life’s challenges with dignity and grace.

It has been important for us to cultivate our relationships in order that we can do our work effectively. We shoulder the burdens and the struggles of ministry, while also celebrating the joys of being in ministry together. We have cried and laughed together. We

are fervent in our prayer life. It is our privilege to serve amongst and with you as both colleagues and partners in ministry.

One of the challenges we continue to face is the foundational principles of our life together, known as itinerancy. We have seen a growing phenomenon where we receive tremendous push back on itinerancy. We understand that appointment making is different in the 21st century. We have adjusted our thoughts and seek to be relevant as a cabinet. Yet, we cannot do what is best for the corporate body when pastors refuse to live into their covenantal vows made at ordination.

Congregations push back at the very thought of their pastor being appointed to another context in ministry. At times, it seems as if we have forgotten that we are in this shared and mutual ministry together. The body suffers when we seek only what is best for me. We have to move beyond the notion that, so long as things are going well for me or us, then I/we do not care about our colleagues or sister congregations. This does not help us in our desire to offer each congregation the best opportunity to make disciples for the transformation of the world, while using the appointment process. Each congregation is important to us. We spend time in prayer and discernment for the ministry of each congregation, while at the same time affirming the appointment process. We desire for ministry to flourish in places where it is currently happening and long for the day that ministry will grow stronger in other places through God's grace. We know folks love their congregations and folks love their pastors. But there are other congregations to be loved, nurtured, and cared for.

Congregations can benefit from a change in pastoral leadership. We would do well to live into the words from the second verse of the hymn "This is my Song." "My skies are bluer than the ocean, and sunlight beams on cloverleaf and pine; but other lands have sunlight too, and clover and skies everywhere are as blue as mine. O hear my song, thou God of all the nations, a song of peace for their land and for mine." We do as best as we can through the appointment process, acknowledging that any human system is not perfect, but we are perfected in God's love. We must remain open to the movement of God's spirit.

We are committed to living into 2013 Annual Conference Resolution P 703 *Creating District Task Teams on New Congregations* (additional information below) where each district has a team in place to look at other places where we can bring new people into a relationship with Christ. We recognize some ask the question, why do we need another place when many of our congregations are less full than in years past? We do believe that we need these places and seek to make new disciples in new places. We balance this by challenging existing congregations to find new ways to reach out into their communities to revitalize ministry, and to bear witness to how God is calling them to respond to the needs around them. We partner with conference staff to visit and to work alongside congregations as you seek to move deeper into the water where you will thirst no longer. Our desire is for ministry to flourish in every context. We believe that this can happen because folks have great commitment and love God and make tremendous sacrifices for the sake of the gospel.

As a Cabinet, we are aware that creating new places for new people also involves supporting and encouraging them to answer the call to set apart ministry, both licensed and ordained. When persons begin the journey of discerning a call into ministry, we, as superintendents, have the privilege of engaging in an initial conversation about that call. Over the past months, we have discussed ways to be more intentional in our recruitment

effort, particularly with youth and young adults. Recently, the Cabinet was blessed to have in our midst during our devotional time several young adults who have attended Exploration, a national United Methodist event designed to assist 18-25 year olds in answering the call to licensed, ordained, and mission ministry. We are committed to discovering and implementing additional ways to aid persons of all ages to hear the call of God, to serve, thus undergirding the goal or creating new places for new people.

Equally important, however, as we move deeper into the 21st Century, ministry must be practiced differently than in the past. Congregations must find their way into various forms of cooperative and shared ministry. Insular thought and doing ministry in isolation (or 'solo') alone from other congregations is a thing of the past.

Congregations must be willing to work together for the sake of Christ. This must be modeled by key lay persons and pastors. Some cabinet members have initiated these conversations within their districts. If we who claim to be Christians cannot work together as partners in ministry, how can we expect those outside of the church to join with us in ministry? We also know that financially congregations find it difficult to maintain their funding of ministry. Yet, we hear the stories of the many ways through which congregations find creative and practical ways to engage in funding ministry. We also find that many congregations do not wish or desire to implement an annual stewardship campaign. We believe it is critical that congregations have an intentional plan to fund ministry and a Christian Educational plan to teach and to practice what it means to live faithfully and effectively using all of the resources that God has given to us to manage. Stewardship is more than money. Yet, financial resources cannot be removed from stewardship emphasis. Intentional ministry that takes into account all of the spiritual disciplines offers the best opportunity for revitalization as we live into the future.

Our hearts ache given where we are as a denomination as it relates to human sexuality. We stand with our Bishop as he referenced in his pastoral letter. We see our role as an extension of his Cabinet to seek the unity of the church. We seek to be pastoral to all persons under our care and to those we seek to bring into relationship with Christ. We all need to remember we long for the water that will quench our thirst forever. We are finding our way into conversations across theological perspectives. Conversation is necessary and offers the best opportunity for us to be in relationship in an era of diverse thoughts, while at the same time reminding us of our theological positions as a denomination. These are not easy times for us as a church but it is an opportunity for us to be the church. We are with you in the midst of the challenges that we face.

Finally, we are grateful for your faithfulness to the connection. We continue with payment of Connectional Apportionments. Many go the second and third miles in the area of mission giving. Connected to this point, our Zimbabwe Partnerships continues to grow stronger. Districts continue their support of sister district projects in Zimbabwe. Six persons will head over as part of the immersion experience, and there will also be a youth delegation going over to visit district partnerships to be part of the Ebenezer experience – a three day Revival celebrating 110 years of Methodism in Zimbabwe.

Friends, we continue to lift you in prayer, challenge you to continue to be the church, by extending the gifts of grace, mercy, and peace, just as Jesus extends those gifts to us.

BUTLER

The Butler District's response is we are adding a sub-team to focus on new church starts to our District Mission Team.

CONNELLSVILLE

The Connessville District is well saturated with churches and has little population in any area. However, we do seek to find a new place for new people. Our District Resource Council has discussed this and all the members of the council have been asked to scour their areas for any possibilities. Our council notes that the Hidden Valley-Seven Springs area has many new homes, and while many are vacation homes, there remains a possibility there. There is also a large need to reach a changing demographic in the Uniontown area where the new growth in population is African American. The council also connected the District Superintendent with a young couple who is leading a home group in the Uniontown area without a church connection in hopes that a plant might begin there, but they are resistant to a connectional system. We also discussed some ministries that are happening outside the walls of the church in the Point Marion, Scottdale and Somerset areas. We do see new people joining in those outreach ministries. We also remain hopeful and prayerful that one of these other possibilities will enjoy a fresh breath of God's empowerment.

ERIE-MEADVILLE

The EM District Superintendency Committee met to map out a plan through which to live into 2013 Resolution P 703. We have identified a number of persons from around the district to be a part of our district task force. We also empowered the district Nominating Committee to name a chair for the task force. These names will all be placed on our ballot at District Conference in April for election.

The group is coming together nicely. So far, everyone discerned is willing to be a part. The idea of finding new places for new people seems appealing to them!

In response to the mandate passed at the 2013 Annual Conference, William Meekins has established the Greensburg Districts' New Church Start Task Team. We have been charged with the discernment of a viable location for the planting of a new congregation within the Greensburg District. For our first meeting, we called upon Chris Brown, co-coordinator of the New Church Plant Initiative from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary to guide our discussion. Brown is also co-pastor of the Upper Room, a new Presbyterian Church start, in Squirrel Hill.

Our discussion centered on the various approaches we might consider when discerning a new church start. Should our main focus be geography (Rt. 22/30 corridor, areas of population growth), a target demographic (age group, undocumented peoples), or a called pastor with the gifts and graces necessary for a new church? While giving us much to consider, we have developed some concrete next steps to take.

Connecting with clergy cluster groups for input concerning their local context of ministry.

Prayer

Visiting suggested sites for a new church.

Prayer

Being open to and seeking out potential leaders and clergy for the new church.

Did I mention prayer?

We look forward to serving the Greensburg District and are excited about the work of the Holy Spirit among us to develop new places for new people! We welcome your input and most importantly keep this committee in your prayers.

JOHNSTOWN

The Johnstown District has recently formed a "Johnstown District City Summit" to examine the present and future viability of our United Methodist presence, particularly in the Greater Johnstown region. Under the leadership of Alyce Weaver Dunn, the District Superintendent, the following persons are currently serving on the City Summit planning team: Randy Bain (Oakland UM); Bruce Griffith (Roxbury St. Paul's UM); Carol Hickman (United for God Cooperative); Terry Knipple (Franklin Street UM); Kathleen McCoy-Schoeneck (Park Avenue & Christ UM Charge); and Kara Ketley, new Director of Johnstown United Methodist Human Services. By mid-February 2014, the planning team will have met two times, and plans include ongoing work in this area, perhaps expanding the conversation to include more clergy and laity.

The over-arching vision of the City Summit planning team is to re-vitalize ministry in the city of Johnstown. In addition to discussion about improving connections with the community, making worship more relevant, consolidating worship sites, and encouraging better stewardship of resources, the team is talking about where the

appropriate places in our region are where “new places for new people” need to be started. There has been some initial discussion about some of our larger, healthier churches launching satellite ministries into neighborhoods where the good news of Christ needs to be shared in transforming ways. Another concept that has been lifted is “re-purposing” one of our church buildings (where corporate life is waning) to be a site for a new worship service/ministry center. In conjunction with Johnstown UMHS, there is a dream emerging about designing a faith community centered in and around our ongoing work with the many persons who live in poverty in our city. Although there are not currently any specific plans set to plant a “new place for new people,” the conversation has certainly begun to give serious consideration as to when, where and how to begin a “new place for new people.”

The Ebensburg United Methodist Church started a new “satellite worship service” on the campus of St. Francis University in October 2013. A lay campus minister is providing onsite leadership for a live simulcast of the Sunday 11:30 AM contemporary worship service that is held in the Ebensburg UM Church. At the beginning of 2014, the satellite worship site is averaging 15-20 college students. The Ebensburg church is exploring ways to expand this new ministry.

The Mount Union UM Church, one of three churches on the Fishertown Charge in the Bedford County region of the District, recently started a “house church” ministry in a local trailer park. The gathering is held on a weeknight in the home of one of park residents, and includes a meal, worship and fellowship. This new ministry grew out of a growing passion to reach “new people” for Christ in the area.

KANE

November 9, 2013: The Kane District Council approved a proposal for organizing the district for the development of missional strategy (see attached). The District Council designated itself as the “task team on new congregations,” that is referred to in 2013 Resolution P-703.

January 11, 2014: The Kane District Council met with Jim Walker, Director of Congregational Development & Revitalization, to seek his advice as to how our team should proceed in the task of birthing new congregations. Walker suggested that we focus on generating ideas “from the ground up” rather than “from the top down.” The District Council decided to enlist the help of our nine cluster groups in the task of discerning potential sites for new communities of faith.

February 12, 2014: An initial meeting of cluster representatives was held, and the assignment was given to return to our next meeting with a list of potential sites in each region.

Organizing the Kane District for the Development of Missional Strategy

PROPOSAL: To establish clusters / “ministry facilitation groups” (where they do not currently exist) and to augment their function (where they do currently exist) for the purpose of developing a missional strategy throughout the Kane District.

PURPOSE: The purpose of such Ministry Facilitation Groups (MFG’s) would be as follows: 1) to oversee our United Methodist Christian witness within a geographic region; 2) to provide a forum for “connecting” pastors and laity in that area; 3) to encourage shared ministry conversations, and the development of new community ministries, as deemed appropriate in each locale; 4) to create a new venue for leadership recruitment and training.

BIBLICAL & DISCIPLINARY FOUNDATION: *There is but one ministry in Christ, but there are diverse gifts and evidences of God's grace in the body of Christ* (Ephesians 4: 4-16). The ministry of all Christians is complementary. No ministry is subservient to another. All United Methodists are summoned and sent by Christ to live and work together in mutual interdependence and to be guided by the Spirit into the truth that frees and the love that reconciles. (2012 *Book of Discipline*, ¶ 131)

Journey of a Connectional People – Connectionalism in the United Methodist tradition is multi-leveled, global in scope, and local in thrust. Our connectionalism is not merely a linking of one charge conference to another. It is rather a vital web of interactive relationships. (2012 BOD, ¶. 132)

PITTSBURGH

The compiled listing of new places for new people in the Pittsburgh District include:

1) A newly reconfigured iteration of the food program on Pittsburgh North Side largely out of the New Hope Church building and part of the Pittsburgh Parish.

These efforts include:

- Daily Bread, a meal event offered several times per week, which 14,000 meals per year, up from 8,000 meals in 2008.
- The addition of health care and clothing provision to those who participate with Daily Bread, as well as the provision of transitional housing and transitional job searching opportunities.
- The Kid's Meal Network, a summer breakfast and lunch program for children. In 2013 more than 3,500 meals were served to children at four sites around the district. Six sites are hoped for the summer of 2014. There are 84,000 children in Allegheny County who are below the national "poverty level".
- The Reading Mentoring program, a weekly reading program at a North Side Elementary School staffed by forty volunteers from six district congregations. In 2013 over 3,500 children participated in these readings, as well as trips to museums and other cultural events.
- A free Eye Glass Ministry offering routine screening for children, which screening the made available eye glasses to more than forty recipients.

2) Renewed outreach of the Church of Our Savior at Northview Heights, which included significant interaction and service with the adjacent Bethany House Ministry. This ministry is reaching the broader community with regular, dynamic worship. 256 attended the 2013 Maundy Thursday Dinner and worship at Church of Our Savior. A twice-weekly program called "Sweating in the Spirit" has provided 60 people opportunity to improve their fitness levels and their health. This program is in its third year.

3) Possible congregational renewals are being attempted in Dormont and in Shadyside/Bloomfield from the Albright Church, which the building is in disrepair.

- 4) A new church start is budding in Stanton Heights, which start has commenced with community outreach and participation.
- 5) Fox Chapel Faith Church has initiated worship and outreach into nearby Sharpsburg along the Allegheny River.
- 6) Living Spirit Ministries of Swissvale is a new iteration of the former Swissvale United Methodist Church, which building was sold in 2009. Living Spirit, now in its 5th year, is reaching new people with its open worship and community outreach and witness in Swissvale in the transitioning Mon Valley.
- 7) Hot Metal Bridge Faith Community, a worship and service venture of the Western PA Conference and the Pittsburgh Presbytery, continues to reach a constantly changing audience of young adults and students from its home in Pittsburgh's South Side. While Hot Metal Bridge has been around for almost a decade, its target constituency is constantly changing.
- 8) Numerous congregations -- specifically Allison Park: St Paul's, Baldwin, Bethel Park: Christ, Coraopolis, Cranberry Township: Dutilh -- have partnered with neighborhood congregations and / or have begun additional worship experiences aimed at a broadening their demographic outreach. In some cases the worship services have been added at the primary site. In other cases the opportunities have been expanded within the wider community or in adjacent communities.

WASHINGTON

The Washington District's focus has been implementing the new church start around Route 19 (Meadowbrook Heights Community).

COMMISSION ON THE STATUS AND ROLE OF WOMEN (cosrow)
June 5, 2014

The start of Annual Conference brings an opportunity to spread some good news regarding the denominations progress towards inclusion.

The General Commission on the Status and Role of Women (GCSRW) reported in "Women by the Numbers" February 2014, that "Clergy diversity [is] proportional to membership". The report found that in 2011, there had been little change in the number of clergy since 2006. However, the percentage of clergy of color rose. In 2006, clergy of color were 10.5%. They were 11.3% in 2011. This is only .8 of a percentage point but represents a 7.6% increase in the number of clergy of color in a 5 year period. The clergy of color also proportionally represent their respective backgrounds nationally. African American clergy membership rose 4%, Asian 7%, and Hispanic 16%. Native American and Pacific Islanders saw decreases of 5% and 4% respectively and White clergy declined by 1%. Multiracial clergy saw the greatest percentage increase, a whopping 260% increase. This represents a willingness of the church to accept multiracial clergy and a level of comfort and acceptance by multiracial clergy to acknowledge themselves as multiracial.

Previously, the most diverse conferences were in the Northeastern and Western Jurisdictions, but North Central has also entered this elite group with diverse conferences based on

- a. At least 5 of the 7 racial-ethnic groups are represented
- b. 4 or more of the Racial-Ethnic categories were represented at greater than 1%
- c. No single category was represented at higher than 75%

GCSRW advocates for each annual conference clergy membership to reflect its lay membership proportionally, as has happened within the church in the United States at large. 1.1% of the membership of Western Pennsylvania was Racial-Ethnic in 2011 and 2.9% of clergy were Racial Ethnic. We had all Racial Ethnic groups represented but none were at the level of 1%. For more information see <http://www.gcsr.org/ResearchMonitoring/WomenbytheNumbers.aspx>. Also see the COSROW display.

The start of Annual Conference began to draw us into a deeper awareness of the diversity of God's world, challenged us to deeper relationship with each other and Jesus. Our lay academies reflected a diversity of theological perspective. Displays challenged us into deeper awareness and examination of the 'Other'. Sign language was used in early worship and the opening worship. Opening worship challenged us to draw deeper in personal holiness and in social holiness. There was a diversity of age, some gender inclusion and Racial Ethnic participation. Our faith is lived out with a diverse body of believers within our churches and throughout the world and "God's Grace and Love extends to all". Last year, COSROW's closing report reminded us that to be an inclusive church took intentionality. Today, our liturgy, prayers, spoken scripture and preaching helped us to see how we might begin to live into that intentionality.

May it continue to be so,

The Bishop also shared his concern over how many congregations don’t understand our United Methodist doctrine, polity, and heritage. He challenged the pastors present to look for ways to share our story and our beliefs with the people called United Methodist.

Before closing the clergy session Bishop Bickerton invited all the clergy to reaffirm their vows from their candidacy and ordination, beginning with John Wesley’s historic questions for those who feel the call of God and ending with the Covenant Prayer.

“Remember your call. Remember your ordination and the vows you made. Remember the covenant you entered into with your sisters and brothers.”

RECESS – After prayer and a hymn, the Clergy Session adjourned at 11:37 AM.

AFTERNOON SESSION

OPENING WORSHIP - At 1:00 p.m., Bishop Thomas J. Bickerton led the opening worship service centered on the theme “Draw Deep.” Using the account of Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well from John 4, he emphasized how Jesus reached out in love across traditional boundaries and then challenged the annual conference to love regardless of the unwritten rules.

SESSIONS COMMITTEE - Barb Moore, chair of the Conference Sessions Committee, highlighted logistical information to make this week a more pleasant experience for everyone. She also explained that this is her last year as chair of the sessions team.

BAR OF THE CONFERENCE - John R. Wilson, Conference Secretary, moved that the bar of the conference be set to include “members who are seated at the tables within the plenary hall.” The motion to set the bar was APPROVED.

ROLL CALL - Conference Secretary John Wilson then explained the roll call of members. Members were guided through the completion of the attendance card and the seating designation card. Laity _____ in attendance, Clergy _____ in attendance plus _____ excused Clergy. Total _____.

ELECTION OF TELLERS - The conference then voted for tellers to serve during this year’s annual conference, as listed in the pre-conference booklet (page 11). The Conference Secretary nominated Daryl Mains as Head Teller. The tellers were ELECTED.

AGENDA - Jude Urso, Agenda Coordinator, moved for the setting of our published agenda (in *Daily Journal* p. 15). APPROVED.

CONFERENCE RULES – Amy Bentz, Conference Chancellor, reported that this year we had no late legislation, therefore there is no need to suspend rules.

In a moment of personal privilege, she thanked the members for their ongoing prayers and support during her time of injury, surgery, and recovery.

CONFERENCE TREASURER – Paul Ritchie, chair of the Council on Finance and Administration, as per ¶612.5.2, nominated Larry Bridge as the new Conference Treasurer, replacing Patricia Morris who retired this past spring. He was ELECTED.

2016 GENERAL CONFERENCE DELEGATE NOMINATIONS – John Wilson, Conference Secretary, explained the procedure to nominate lay delegates. Laity were then given an opportunity to nominate lay delegates.
