



Our Keynote Presenter: Rev. Dr. Jacqui King

Jacqui King serves as the Director of Leadership for Congregational Vitality at Discipleship Ministries of The United Methodist Church. She develops leadership resources for local congregations, engages network groups in new processes that implement core strategies for increasing congregational vitality, and facilitates online learning through webinars. She has taught in every US jurisdiction for Lay Servant events, led district and conference workshops, coached for congregational visioning projects, and explored new ways to increase vitality through the community engagement.

As an elder ordained in the Texas Annual Conference, Rev. Dr. King became a pioneer for connecting technology and faith-based community building by launching an online experience in 2007. She is a trained Interim Ministry Specialist, a Professional Coach Training Graduate, and a Fund Development Specialist from The Fund Raising School. With advanced education including both business and theological studies, she has achieved two masters degrees: an MBA from Smeal College of Business at Penn State University and an M.Div from Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University.

Rev. Dr. King completed her Doctor of Ministry degree at Drew Theological School in 2012 with a focus on global leadership development. Her dissertation was "Hear2Heal: Embrace a New Vision."

Rev. Dr. King is married to Donel King. She believes that education can create avenues for all to become empowered to live into their callings from the Lord.
